- ECCQ was established in 1976
  - Main focus: supporting and advocating for the needs, interests and contributions of CALD communities

### **My Health for Life Program (MH4L):**

- Funded by Queensland Health and implemented by Better Health Alliance (Diabetes QLD, Heart Foundation, PHNs, ECCQ, Stroke Foundation and Queensland Aboriginal and Islander Health Council)
- ECCQ is responsible for tailoring the program resources to CALD target groups and delivering the program to CALD communities in QLD.
- Target communities: Chinese (Mandarin and Cantonese speaking), Vietnamese, Arabic Speaking and Pacific Islander
- The program is delivered by bi-lingual trained health workers in community language and simplified English to target CALD communities across the state
