

# Free COVID-19 RAT Kits

For Ukrainians in Queensland - August 2022

This factsheet explains how people who have recently come to Queensland from the Ukraine can now access free COVID-19 Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) kits.

Queensland Health is providing free RAT kits to people who have Australian Government concession cards. Many recent Ukrainian arrivals will not be eligible for these. For this reason, Queensland Health has expanded its eligibility for accessing RAT kits.

If you arrived in Australia from the Ukraine from **1 December 2021**, and you do not hold any Australian Government concession cards, you can now access RAT kits for free. You can collect up to 5 RAT tests per month and collect all 5 RAT kits in a single visit.

## Where can I get a free RAT kit?

Queensland Health is now distributing RAT kits at many locations in the community. Find your nearest distribution point [here](#), or scan the QR code below.

## What do I need to show the staff at the distribution point?

If you have an Australian Government concession card (such as a health care card or pension card), you can provide this.

If you do not hold any of these cards:

1. Tell staff that you recently arrived from the Ukraine. Show them your passport photo and stamp showing that you have arrived from Ukraine **since 1 December 2021**.
2. You can show this fact sheet to staff if they are unaware of your eligibility.

It does not matter which visa you are currently on, so long as you arrived after the date stated above. You will need to provide this information every time you visit a distribution point. Wear a face mask if you have any COVID-19 symptoms.

## Where can I get help if I have COVID-19?

If you test positive for COVID-19 you should [report your RAT test result here](#). From **Friday 9 September 2022**, the COVID-19 isolation period will reduce from 7 days to 5 days, provided you have no symptoms and don't work in aged care, disability care or home care.
